Current Projects

- Work is ongoing on review of regulation and processes to identify areas where efficiencies could be made
- Pilot program started September 1, 2020 allowing for increased seasonal weights for all-terrain cranes
- Alberta Transportation is moving forward with the installation of public Wi-Fi at all 17 manned VIS in Alberta.

The End of Continuous Carriers

- Following a review after the Humbolt bus crash, the Commercial Vehicle Certificate and Insurance Regulation was changed so that all SFCs issued prior to March 1, 2019 would now expire on February 28, 2022.
- Prior to March 1, 2019 all SFCs were issued as “Continuous” and did not expire.
- As of March 1, 2022, all SFCs will be issued for a term of 3 years.

As of December 3, 2021

1,889 – Certificates Renewed

15,947 – Continuous Certificates Remaining

Steps to Renew

- Carriers must complete a [SFC Renewal Application](#) online.
- The application fee is \$110 and they will be issued a certificate for a term of 3 years.
- The renewed certificate and future renewal reminders are available electronically through Alberta Transportation's Online Services website.

Carriers That Fail to Renew

- Carriers that do not renew prior to February 28, 2022 will have their certificate cancelled and cannot legally operate.
- Carriers seeking to renew their certificate after April 15, 2022 will be required to apply as a new carrier and complete Alberta's Pre-Entry Program.
