

### **TRAVIS Modernization**

- New TRAVIS Permitting/Routing system expected to be in place for Fall 2023.
- TRAVIS provides permits for most jurisdictions within the Province, including municipalities and counties
- Work is being done with a vendor to develop a new permitting system that expands on current TRAVIS capabilities and modernizes the permitting process.
- Currently AT is in early development



### **Economic Corridors**

- Economic corridors can be defined as routes that provide vital links to markets in and out of Alberta, supporting economic, social, and environmental activity.
  - High Load Corridor (OSOW)
  - CANAMEX/North-South Trade Corridor

• Corridors can involve a broad range of infrastructure including transportation, energy, power, telecommunications and other utilities. In addition to physical infrastructure, corridors include service markets and the coordination of regulations and policies across multiple jurisdictions and sectors.
