National Freight Growth

Delays and inefnciencies ripple through national economy.

State-by-State Differences

Increased costs. delays for industry, and slower emergency response,

The nation's highway system is central



CURRENT REALITY

- States individually issue permits, for loads exceeding standard weigts/ dimensions.
- These OS/OM shipments are increasing, in both volume and economic importance, especially for energy, mani/facturing, and infrastructure sectors.
- Differences in requirements (e.g. escort rules, travel times, routing protocols) can create multi-state bottlenecks.

COLLABORATION IS KEY

- Efficient freight movement re requires close copperation between government and business.
- AASHTO Subcommittee on Highway Transport has maintained the Guide for Vehicle Weights and Dimensions since 1937,
- The Subcommittee has idevtified permit procedures that can behamonized without compromising safety or infrastructure

THE CALL TO ACTION

Harmonizing truck permit requirements among states will:

- Improve customer service
- Reduce costs
- Increase efficiency In state go: Support economic growth



AASHTO PERMIT HARMONIZATION

- Seek solutions less restrictive or status quo, not more restrictive
- Balance consistency while maintaining safety
- Recommend voluntary harmonization, not mandatory uniformity
- Phase I and Phase II baselines unanimously adopted by AASHTO in 2012 and 2013



WHAT IS HARMONIZATION?

RESOLVED That AASHTO member states are <u>committed to harmonizing permit procedures</u> and requirements between states, among states in regions, and on multi-state corridors; and be it further

RESOLVED That by this resolution the AASHTO Board of Directors establishes a truck oversize/overweight permit harmonization initiative to focus initially on the following requirement categories (consistent with the AASHTO Guide for Vehicle Weights and Dimensions);

RESOLVED That the Subcommittee on Highway Transport will <u>identify additional candidates for</u> <u>truck oversize/overweight permit harmonization, coordinate with private sector shippers and <u>carriers, and present additional initiatives to SCOH</u> for submission to the AASHTO Board of Directors for implementation.</u>

Holiday Restrictions	Noon Day before holiday – Sunrise Day after Holiday for 6 US federal holidays States may establish others unique to jurisdiction
Days/Hours of Operation	Daylight Monday – Saturday Sunday states make determination
Type/Size of Escort	Legal size Class I, II, or III passenger vehicle 360 visibility Not towing vehicle or trailer
Height Escort when pole required	Front escort with a pole if height > 4.42 m

Unanimously adopted by AASHTO in 2014


SC&RA PHASE III PRIORITIES

- Promote a safety culture between industry and law enforcement to ensure mutual responsibility, accountability and reasonable enforcement.




